

Trip to wychwood and brakspear brewery Sunday 27 June

The brewery have a maximum capacity for 14 guests on a tour at one time, a tour of the brewery will last approximately 45 minutes, plus additional tasting time. They have kindly agreed to bring in two tour guides for us on the Sunday.

The first tour will start at 14:00 and the second tour at 14:30, this should give the first party time to familiarise themselves with the on-site store and bar.

We currently have **3** places still available, as the brewery have gone to some effort laying on additional staff I don't really want to turn up without a full party – if you know of anyone who may like to come, or if you need to pull out then please contact me ASAP.

Ride detail summary – (allowing 2 hours for a leisurely ride arriving at the Wychwood and Brakspear brewery Witney)

Heading to the Brewery - The nice scenic route

- Meet at Broad Street at 11:45
- Leave Broad Street at 12:00
- Head to Walton Street and enter Port Meadow
- Cross the Thames and follow the path past the Perch at Binsey and the Trout in Wolvercote
- Cross Wolvercote and head up to Yarnton
- From Yarnton head to Worton
- Worton to Long Hanborough
- Long Hanborough to North Leigh
- North Leigh into Witney
- The Wychwood Brewery

When we arrive at the brewery I have arranged for us to be able to lock our bikes in one of their warehouses. It should be secure but as always ensure you bring a lock

Heading away from the brewery – A Shorter route combing scenic and the direct A40 cycle path

- The Wychwood brewery
- Head to South Leigh
- South Leigh to Eynsham
- Eynsham to the A40 cycle path
- A40 cycle route back into Oxford city via the Wolvercote roundabout.
 - From here we may decide to follow the Thames path back past the Trout and Perch (perhaps stopping to clench our thirsts?!) or head back to Broad street or home

I hope the route and timings suit everyone's riding styles, if not please let me know ASAP.

Equipment

We recommend that you bring along with you any cycling equipment that you may need to ensure your safety and comfort along the ride (i.e. pumps, puncture repair and pannier bags to carry home your beer! ☺)

The Brewery Tour

Please see below details supplied by the brewery about what to expect during their tour

The tour itself lasts 45 minutes and takes you through the brewing process, from seeing the raw ingredients to the finished product, taking in the copper, mash tun and Brakspear's famous Double Drop system. After

the tour please allow a further 45 minutes as you are invited to sample Hobgoblin and Brakspear beers fresh from the cask in our taproom, whilst the tour guides answers any questions & this includes time to visit the brewery store where you are able to buy our merchandise or a selection of our bottled beers. 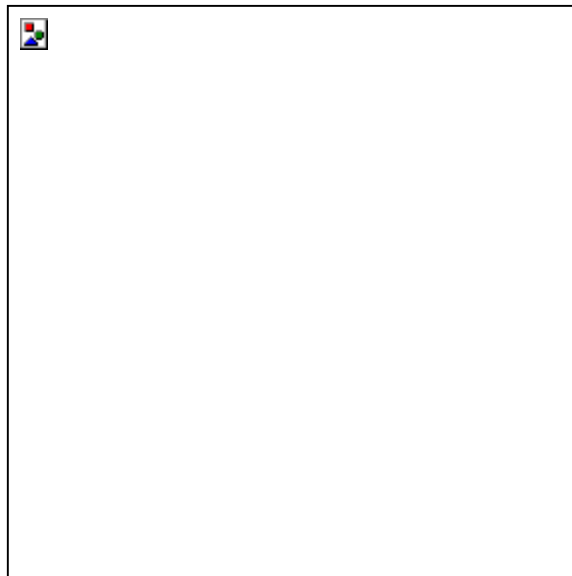
