## Cyclox members

### What personal data do we collect from our members?

Cyclox collects personal data that is necessary for the purposes of its legitimate interests as a membership organisation. We only collect the personal data you provide on joining Cyclox:

## Where is this data held?

This data is held on our membership database at [membermojo.co.uk/cyclox](http://membermojo.co.uk/cyclox), which is secured by SSL encryption with Cloudflare protection. You can read more on membermojo's security and privacy of your data [here](#).

## How long do we keep this data?

Unless you have opted out, we will keep your membership record on file for 24 months after your membership expires. We will use your contact details to send renewal reminders 12 and 15 months after your subscription has lapsed. Unless you have agreed otherwise, your membership record will be deleted after 24 months.

## Who has access to this data?

The database can be accessed by the Cyclox Membership Secretary, Treasurer, Chair, Events Secretary, and Coordinator. Members of the Board of Trustees may be required to access the database if necessary to fulfil a legitimate interest of the organisation. Downloaded membership data is password protected and kept no longer than needed to complete essential administrative tasks. Under [General Data Protection Regulation](#) (GDPR) rules, Cyclox does not have a statutory requirement to appoint a Data Protection Officer. The Cyclox Membership Secretary is responsible for ensuring our membership database is compliant with GDPR.

## How do I make sure my data is accurate and up to date?

Our members can view and edit the information we hold by logging into [membermojo](#). You will be required to enter the email address you registered with for an access link to be emailed to you. On clicking on the email access link, select 'Your Membership' in the menu bar to view and update your details.

## Email communications

## What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files containing a string of characters that can be placed on your computer or mobile device that uniquely identify your browser or device.

## What are cookies used for?

Cookies allow a site or services to know if your computer or device has visited that site or service before. Cookies can then be used to help understand how the site or service is being used, help you navigate between pages efficiently, help remember your preferences, and generally improve your browsing experience. Cookies can also help ensure marketing you see online is more relevant to you and your interests.

## What types of cookies does Cyclox use?

We use cookies for tracking and performance. These cookies allow us to count visits and traffic sources so we can measure and improve the performance of our site. They help us to know which pages are the most and least popular and see how visitors move around the site. All information these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore anonymous.

## How long will cookies stay on my device?

The length of time a cookie will stay on your computer or mobile device depends on whether it is a “persistent” or “session” cookie. Session cookies will only stay on your device until you stop browsing. Persistent cookies stay on your computer or mobile device until they expire or are deleted.
